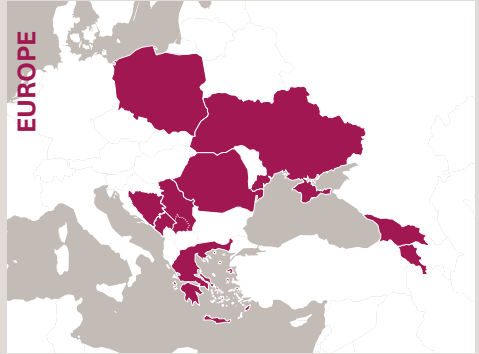
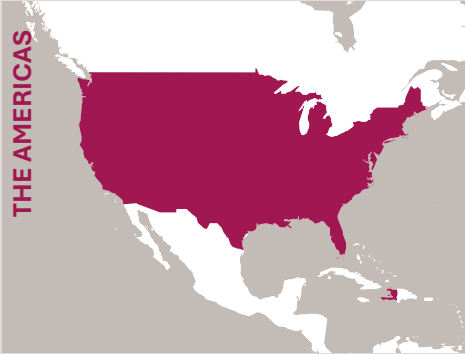

2024 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

IOCC is meeting immediate humanitarian needs and providing long-term development support as communities recover from crises and build their futures. The following sections show glimpses of IOCC programs across our core sectors.

UNITED STATES • (above) In the fall of 2024, Hurricanes Helene and Milton struck the southeastern US causing catastrophic damage to homes, businesses, and communities. In the aftermath of the storms, IOCC field staff conducted clean-up and muck out work on damaged homes, preparing them for the rebuilding process.



ETHIOPIA • (above) IOCC treated more than 96,000 individuals in Ethiopia suffering from podoconiosis, a debilitating condition characterized by painful swelling of the lower legs and feet.



GAZA • In 2024, IOCC continued to provide emergency aid including water, food, and hygiene items to people sheltering at St. Porphyrios Monastery in Gaza. Displaced people with chronic health issues were also given medicine to help them with their conditions.





UKRAINE • IOCC's initial projects in 2024 provided access to shelter for 1,000 internally displaced persons (IDPs) and individuals with special needs. Thanks to the project's success, access to shelter was extended to 2,000 IDPs and persons with disabilities.





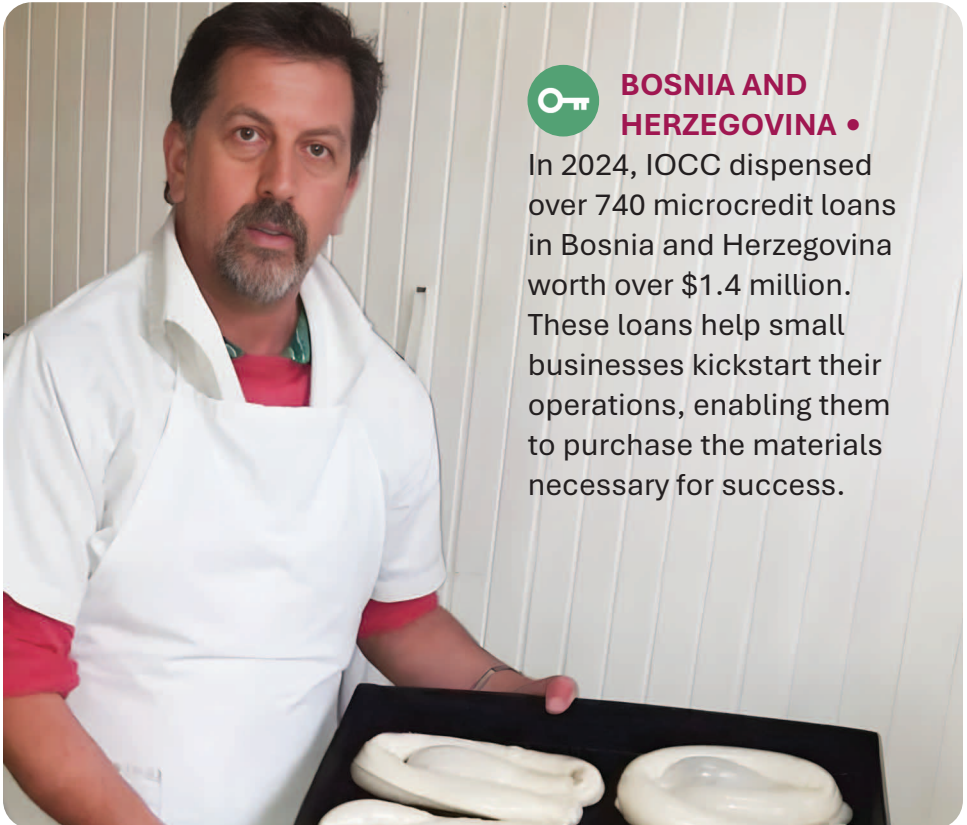
GREECE • Responding

equipment to 12 families
and 3 public schools,
where 100 school kits
were delivered to
an equal number
of students.



**BOSNIA AND
HERZEGOVINA** •

In 2024, IOCC dispensed
over 740 microcredit loans
in Bosnia and Herzegovina
worth over \$1.4 million.
These loans help small
businesses kickstart their
operations, enabling them
to purchase the materials
necessary for success.





LEBANON • (above) In 2024, IOCC's school snack program provided nutritious meals to over 63,000 students across more than 100 public schools in Lebanon. Daily cheese sandwiches plus fruits and vegetables are all sourced from small and medium-sized local enterprises.



ARMENIA • (below) IOCC and partner Armenia Round Table (ART) provided cash assistance to more than 1,500 displaced persons in 2024, allowing them to purchase basics like clothing, food, diapers, formula, and personal care items.

SYRIA • (right)
In 2024, IOCC,

along with local Orthodox partner the Department of Ecumenical Relations and Development (DERD) of the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Antioch and All the East, worked to address the emergency needs of more than 13,000 individuals, providing food, nonfood items, and psychosocial support.



JORDAN • (above) In Jordan, IOCC offered health, rehabilitation, and education services to people with

audio-visual impairments and other disabilities. To address their conditions, IOCC provided hearing aids, glasses, low-vision devices, mobility aids, prosthetics, and wheelchairs, giving hope to those with extra needs.



GEORGIA • In Georgia, a newly constructed school building was going unused due to a non-functioning kitchen and other missing essentials. To get the school up and running, IOCC donated computer equipment, kitchenware, and furniture for the classrooms and other areas.





HAITI • In 2024, civil unrest in Haiti caused food prices to skyrocket as supplies became harder and harder to get.

IOCC stepped in to deliver food to schoolchildren and their families, including rice, cooking oil, beans, sugar, and packs of spaghetti.



LEBANON • As the conflict

in Lebanon escalated, a humanitarian crisis emerged as people fled their homes in search of safety. IOCC was there on the ground, doing its part to support those who had been displaced.

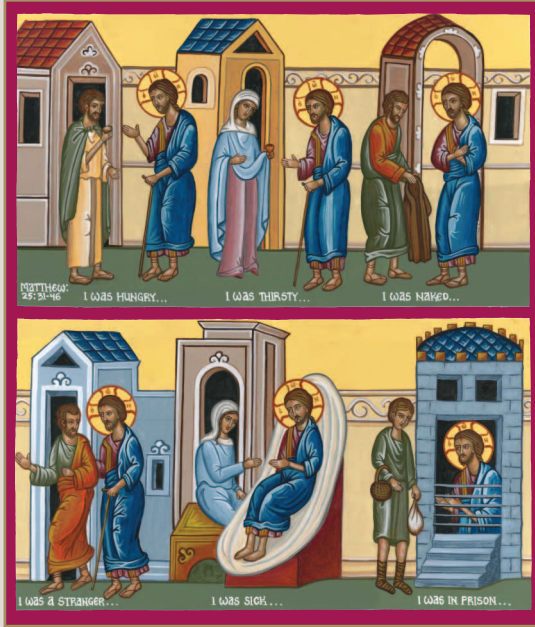
